Former head of State Police Association retires in midst of federal probe

BOSTON — The former head of the State Police Association of Massachusetts has retired amid a federal probe, 5 Investigates has learned.

Dana Pullman has retired after 30 years with the Massachusetts State Police.

Pullman resigned in September after a federal investigation was launched into the association's finances.

Pullman's attorney Martin Weinberg called Pullman a "quintessential union leader" and is optimistic the federal investigation will conclude without any charges against his client.

Weinberg said Pullman didn't violate any laws.

Pullman's retirement was effective Nov. 2.
